### **TOPIC: WHICH BCCS AND SCCS SHOULD BE REFERRED FOR ADJUVANT RADIOTHERAPY?**

#### **TOPIC: EXPERIENCE AS A MELANOMA PATIENT AND HER PATH TO COMMENCING THE ADVOCACY GROUP**

Tamara has had a career in government policy, economics, international trade and corporate affairs. In 2015 she had a late-stage melanoma diagnosis and underwent successful treatment. Tamara became increasingly involved as a melanoma consumer/advocate, and identified that more could be done to help address the needs of skin cancer patients. From early detection, through to coping with a serious diagnosis, as well as more funding for research and a committed advocacy approach. Combined with an eagerness to use her professional skills in the skin cancer community, led her to the establishment of MSCAN.
