# Community members invited to help shape creative therapies

Murray PHN is seeking input from community members to help design services for a new creative therapies pilot for people living with mental health conditions in Castlemaine.

People with lived experience, support people and other interested community members living in and around Castlemaine are invited to share their ideas by attending a face-to-face focus group on Tuesday 27 May. There will be two sessions held in Castlemaine – 1.30pm and 6pm – with the opportunity to complete a digital survey for anyone unable to attend on the day. The pilot will provide access to music and art therapy services, facilitated by registered therapists who will work with participants and their supports to improve their health through creative activities. Participants don't need to have any music or art experience to benefit. The pilot will start in mid-late 2025 and run for two years.

Murray PHN CEO Matt Jones said ensuring the pilot is locally-driven will help ensure services are accessible and effective.

"We encourage interested community members, service providers, mental health professionals, carers and people with lived experience to have their say and help shape these new creative therapy services," Mr Jones said. ""Evidence shows that creative therapy interventions have positive impacts on people experiencing a range of mental health conditions, and this pilot will serve as a complement to other longer-term supports in the region."
